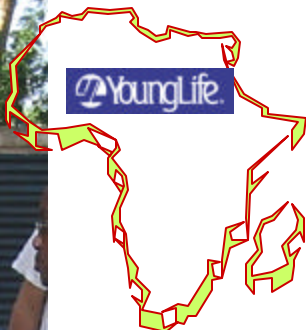

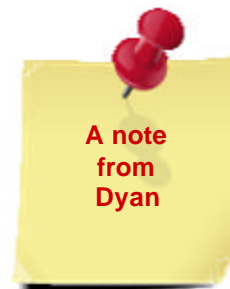

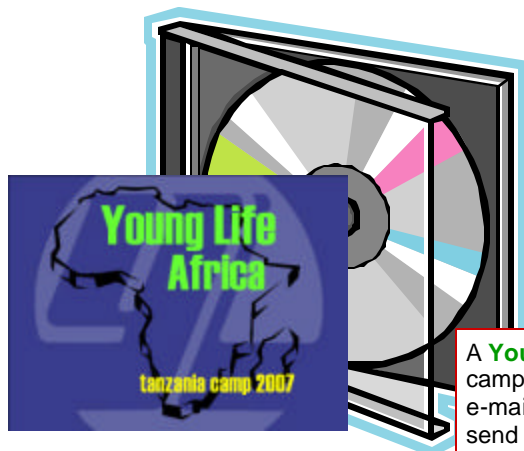

We are thankful for all the groups and work teams that came to Africa this summer to build and lead and serve and dig and play and teach and clean



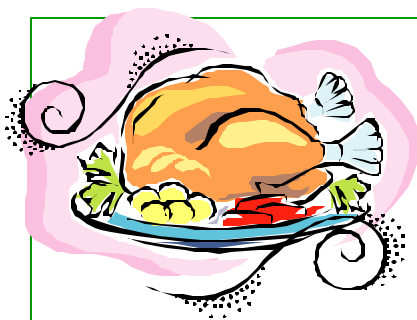
