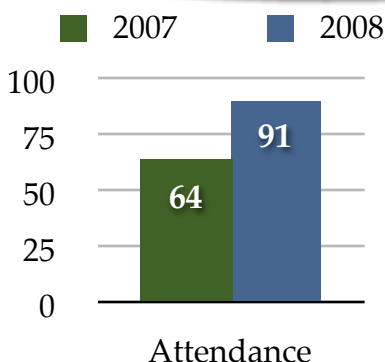


Winter Wonderland Club
